Ash felling

There is some urgency with the branches/trees on the boundary as Gobey's cattle go back in the field in early April. Cathy also suggested contacting Jim Hannis at Cranham sawmill who might be able to help, and might be a good contact for planking in the future.

WORKING GROUP REPORTS

Social/events group:

We are looking at:

- 1. Proposing a simple process and a set of information which a person running an event at the wood should be aware of (to include details for visitors, risk assessments and recording, in consultation with Dom).
- 2. Balancing the five different types of events that take place at the wood:
 - a) Members' meetings
 - b) Work days
 - c) Events to which all members are encouraged to come, including celebrations and marking the seasons
- d) Events created by members such as singing, cooking or woodcraft skills, to which all members are invited
- e) Events booked by members for their friends and families, e.g. birthday parties

- 3. Talking with the ecology group about an appropriate, sustainable level of human activity and then devising ways of managing the number (and size) of bookings each year.
- 4. Encouraging wood members to offer to run activities to which all members are invited (b, c and d) e.g. people like working in the wood and would like to use the bowl as a theatre!

Ecology group:

We have had one meeting so far and are focusing on:

- 1. Trees: Ash felling where necessary. Tree felling in general, particularly the larch. What species to plant? Creating possible clearings. Trees will be mapped by Beth.
- 2. Flora: The list of flora produced by John Rees is now on the website. Bob Bray will be supplying snowdrops to plant in spring. Primroses will also survive in shade. Small Woods are running a day course in Brecon on edible food, which we might attend.
- 3. Fauna: There will be a bat survey in spring. A birdwatching day is proposed, possibly a moth trap too. Bird boxes suggested.
